MEMORANDUM

TO: Members of C.S.I.

RE: 8th International Congress of Immunology
Budapest, Aug. 23-28, 1992

The Society has booked a block of 85 rooms in the Hotel Gellert and a block of 30 rooms in the Thermal Hotel Aquincum for the Budapest congress through International Corporate Travel of Montreal. There is a significant shortage of hotel space in Budapest and not all of it is in very good condition. We are assured the two hotels in which we have rooms are very good both in terms of the hotels themselves and their settings. Further, the price is below that charged through the Congress Center. To get a hotel reservation, you must also book air travel through International Corporate Travel to either Vienna (with a free car for one week) or Budapest. The airline is KLM. Airfare is no more than \$1328 (and may be much less if there is a seat sale as there was last summer).

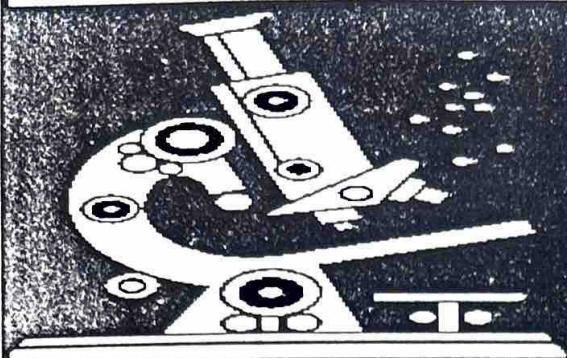

Cell To Cell Interaction

A Karger Symposium

Processes such as cell-cell recognition, cell adhesion, and cell migration are of fundamental importance during embryonic development and in the fully differentiated stage. During the past decade, an increasing number of molecules that mediate cell-cell and cell-matrix interactions have been discovered, characterized and cloned. **Cell to Cell Interaction**, the result of an interdisciplinary symposium, presents the latest findings on cell-cell and cell-matrix interactions in the fields of neurobiology, oncology and immunology.

Leading international investigators present current data on cell adhesion molecules, integrins, immunoglobulins, homing receptors and cytokines, and elucidate their role in morphogenesis, tumor invasion and metastasis. The differentiation, proliferation and cooperation of the multiple cell types of the immune system are also discussed. The clinical applications of all of these new discoveries are considered.

This collection of papers offers a unique perspective of a fast moving area of research. It provides scientists from several different fields with the basic knowledge necessary for understanding the underlying pathophysiological mechanisms of disease and gives new insights for solving future research problems.
