Dr. Caron earned his PhD at the University of Montreal under Dr. Claude Perreault, followed by postdoctoral training at ETH-Zürich with Dr. Ruedi Aebersold. A pioneer in his field, he launched the Human Immunopeptidome Project, serving as Chair from 2015 to 2020. After starting his independent career as a Principal Investigator at the University of Montreal in 2018, Dr. Caron joined Yale School of Medicine in 2023. He currently holds appointments within the Department of Immunobiology, the Yale Center for Immuno-Oncology, the Yale Center for Infection and Immunity, and the Yale Center for Systems and Engineering Immunology.
