Dr. Deanna Santer is an Assistant Professor and GlaxoSmithKline Research Chair in Immunology of Infectious Diseases at the University of Manitoba (as of November 2020). She received her PhD in Immunology from the University of Washington and completed post-doctoral training at the University of Alberta studying antiviral immunity and the immunoregulatory roles of the newest family of interferons (type III

interferons). Dr. Santer's research group aims to understand how interferons modulate immune responses against pathogens or during periods of chronic inflammation (eg. inflammatory bowel disease).
